Since it's a short week, we'll be updating you with our usual classroom news in next week's edition. I would like to take this opportunity to mention important things coming up in Secondary over the next few weeks.

Grade 8 met online with Mr Hopton and myself a few weeks ago, when we presented information regarding their IGCSE subjects for next year. From August 2020, IGCSEs will be divided into core (compulsory) and option subjects. We did an informal survey to find out the types of subjects they might be interested in for their options. Parents and students will receive detailed information on the process at the beginning of next week.

Grades 10 and 11 are submitting their final pieces of exam work and coursework for submission to Cambridge. This will be collated next week as we start sending predicted grades to the exam board.
