## Year 11 IGCSE Coordinated Sciences...

Year 11 students are approaching their final IGCSE exams, and have already been getting prepared through multiple revision tests. The students have already revised the whole curriculum that they have covered in the past, along with the new knowledge they were gaining through the year. As the school year is coming to an end for them, we closed the curriculum by studying the topic of electricity which shared interest with all three sciences; from circuits and volts, to electrolysis and to firing of neurons - a proper way to wrap up a curriculum involving an equal measure of physics, chemistry and biology. From now on, our students will have to work on solving past paper questions in the class, where they will get more confident with understanding the "command terms" in the questions. Good luck, Year 11 - you're doing a great job!

## Think Pink!

There's nothing better than a bit of impromptu learning...

To find out how fast a liquid (water or nutrients) can travel to the extremities of a cell, our students did a special experiment looking at changing the surface area to measure rates of diffusion. The smaller the surface area, the faster the diffusion!

Biology and Chemistry combined in this study, as students went on to look at how our cells respond to changes in pH levels. We used a special agar jelly, and a phenolphthalein indicator. When we introduced sodium hydroxide (a chemical found in your favourite pretzels!), the jelly turned bright pink, to show it had been exposed to an alkali. Once again, reducing the surface area made it change to pink much faster!
