Years 1 & 2

I am immensely proud of these 11 superstars who have settled into the new classroom routines and lesson pace quickly and smoothly. We paid a particular focus this week to break and lunch times, where the children were rewarded for kindness to others, including children in their games, using a children's knife to cut their food and for sensible lunchtime behaviour.



In maths, Year 1 studied place value to 10/20, whilst Year 2 recapped 'one more' and 'one less'. This is particularly challenging when crossing into the previous/next ten (49-->50!)

In English we began studying our book for the next few weeks- Jack and the Beanstalk. The children sequenced the story and will use their phonics/spelling knowledge to add single word/sentence captions next week!



Years 3 & 4

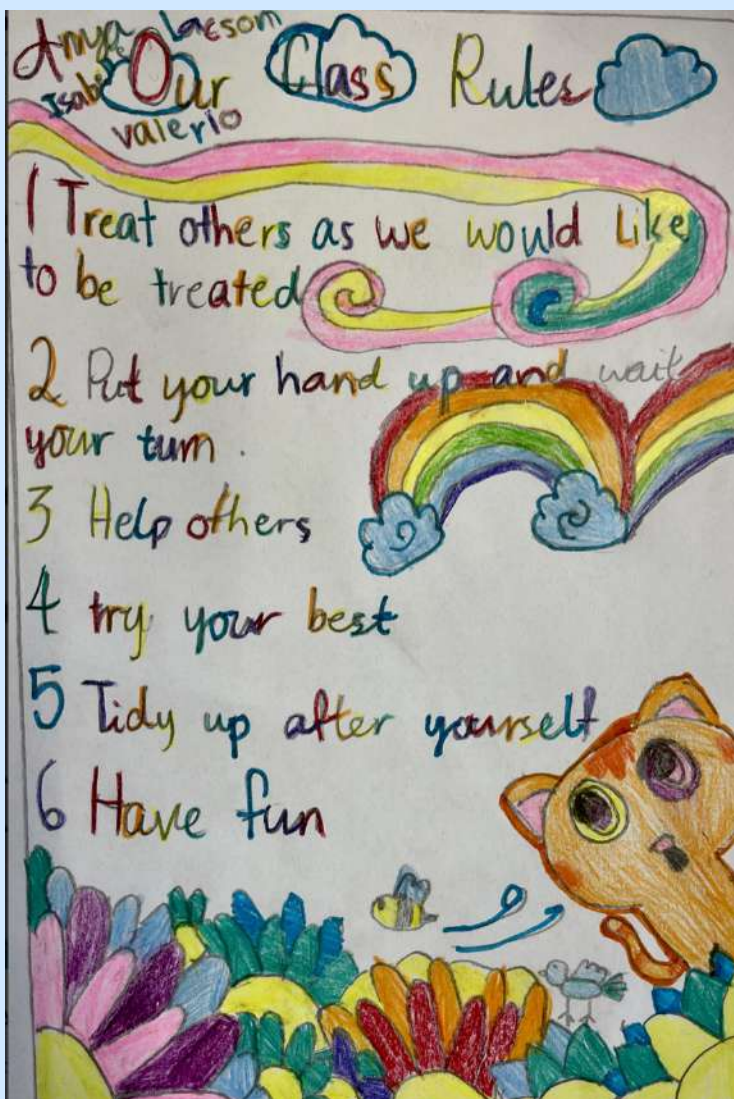
We have had an amazing start. We are happy to welcome our new class members and have found out loads about each other and are making friends. We are starting to work on number value in maths to four digits, thinking about verbs in English and will start reading *The BFG* by Roald Dahl. Everyone should have a reading book of their own. We have begun to look at our science topic on Animal Skeletons including Humans. The class had a great time making life size skeletons by working in groups drawing around each other and then cutting out the major bones. In Global Perspectives the children are finding out about transportation and how our food gets to us.



Years 5 & 6

This week we wasted no time in getting into our regular school routines. Our first lesson involved us creating a class rules charter so that everyone feels safe, respects the boundaries and is clear about the expectations of behaviour in our class. Mr Hawthorne assigned us class jobs and we started to think about who we would like to represent the class on the school council. In Maths, we started to look at the value of digits in numbers up to 10 million and in Literacy we discussed what we had been doing over the summer and looked at how we could communicate these ideas to another person through letters, postcards and emails.

In German we started getting familiar with the vocabulary and objects of the world around us, we discussed the products coming from German language countries, and German names of the things you can buy in a supermarket.

I hope to transmit the passion I feel for the culture and the Language of Spanish to my students.

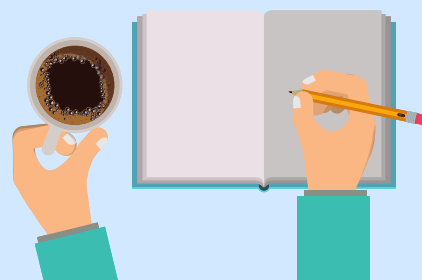
In my free time, I love reading, going trekking and enjoying nature.
