In **English** this week, **key stage three** students have been working on creating some festive 'blackout poetry'!

With its origins being from the eighteenth century, blackout poetry (also known as erasure or redacted poetry) has a goal of using pre-existing texts to create something totally unique. In this form of poetry, some sections from the original text are kept, while other parts are 'blacked out' to produce a brand new, original piece.

The Year 7 students had a great time choosing their words, creating alternative meanings and were very proud of the end results! It's a liberating way to approach poetry, allowing students to see that they can create something beautiful and meaningful from someone else's thoughts...



- HIGH SCHOOL NEWS -

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This piece of coursework is a descriptive piece of writing, which gives students the opportunity to create images, use a wide range of language devices and to develop an atmosphere for their reader. The idea of this piece is to make what is ordinary, EXTRA-ordinary!



Descriptive coursework allows students to write in the present tense, focusing on the five senses in their writing. Good descriptive pieces include thoughts and feelings, vocabulary used for a specific effect, a sense of place and a 'moment in time' style of writing.

For their iGCSE, all students must produce three pieces of writing which will account for 50% of their overall grade at the end of their studies.
