- 7. Bookworms Unite:** Reading enthusiasts have created book club groups, diving into exciting tales and sharing their thoughts and imaginations.

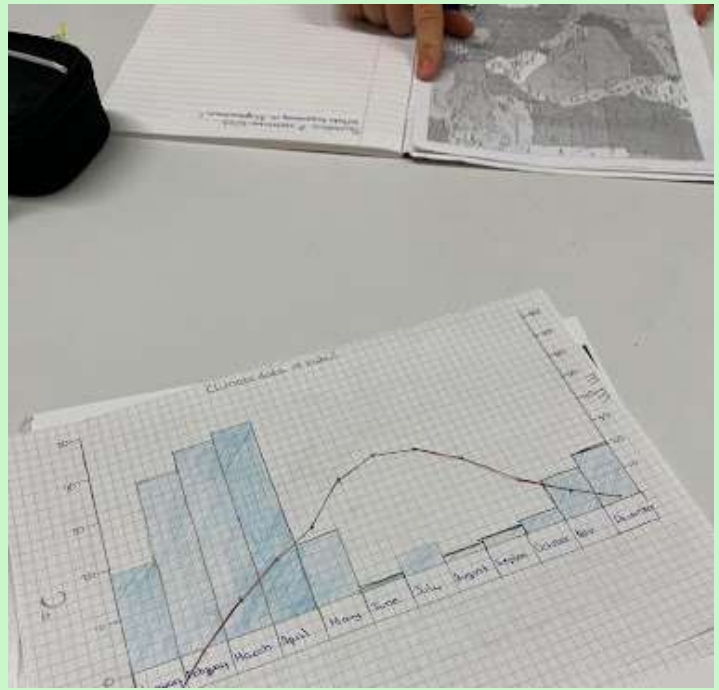
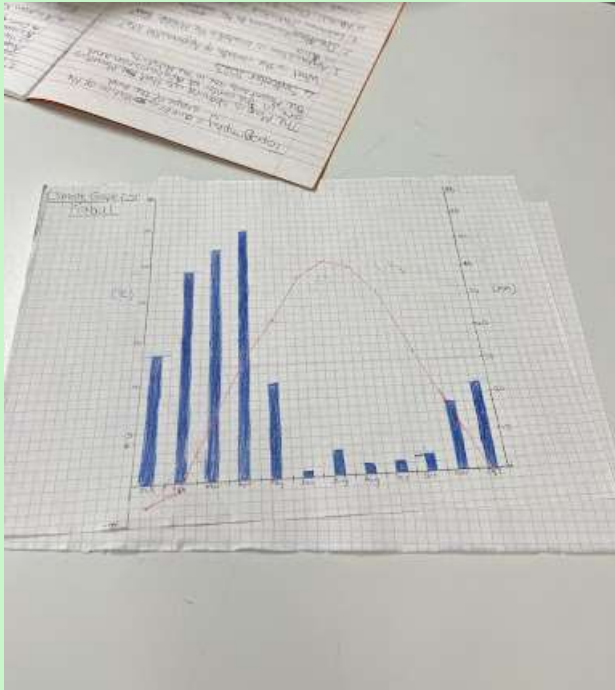
**Year 6** is buzzing with enthusiasm, and we can't wait to see what else this year has in store for us. Stay tuned for more exciting updates from our dynamic class!
