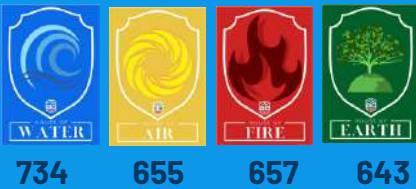

Thank you all for your ongoing dedication, teamwork, and school spirit. Let's continue to work together, support each other, and make this year one of growth and success.

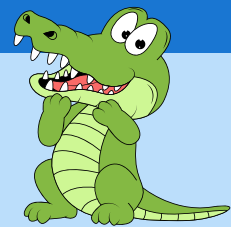

Thank you to all the families for taking an active part in our learning journey! Your continued support is very much appreciated.

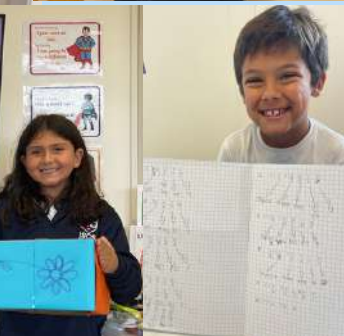
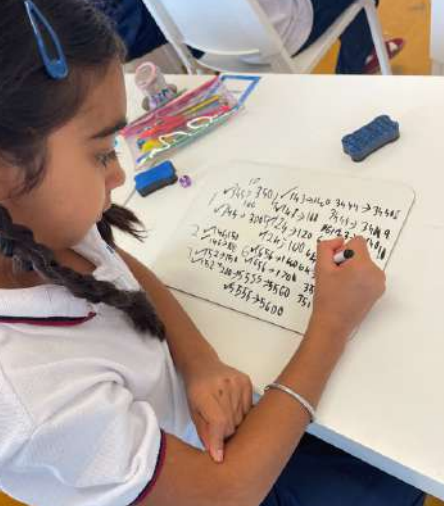
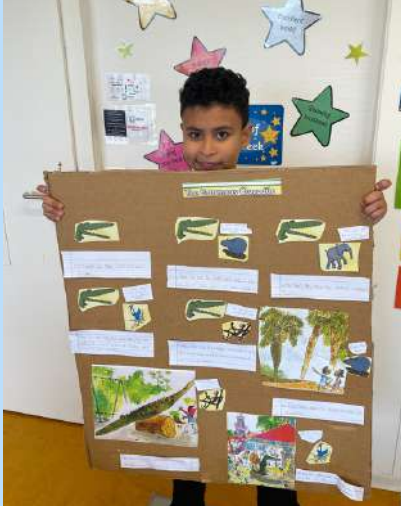
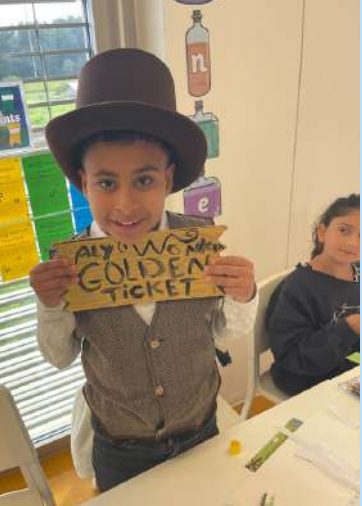
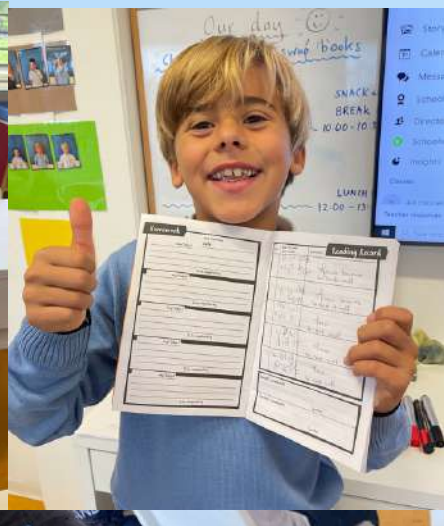
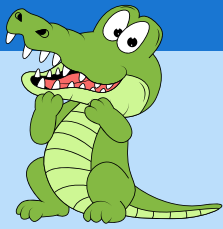

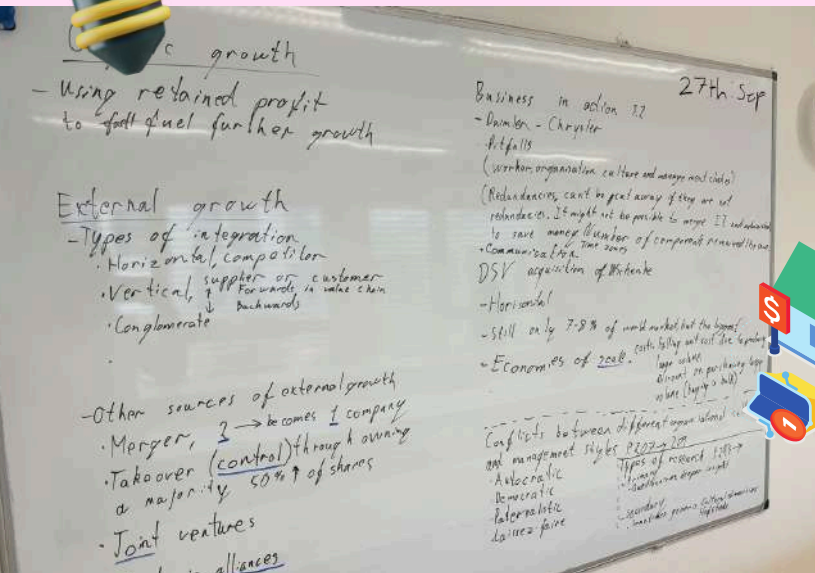
Business & Economics



Studying business gives a special insight into the world that surrounds us. Not everyone likes politics, football or baking, but every single one of us engage in the market. Sometimes as customers and sometimes as producers and providers of products and services.

This year ISCS has introduced A-Level Economics. This subject gives pupils a clear understanding of how economic systems function, both locally and globally. Pupils learn to assess real-world issues like inflation, unemployment, and economic growth, giving them the tools to navigate complex financial landscapes. 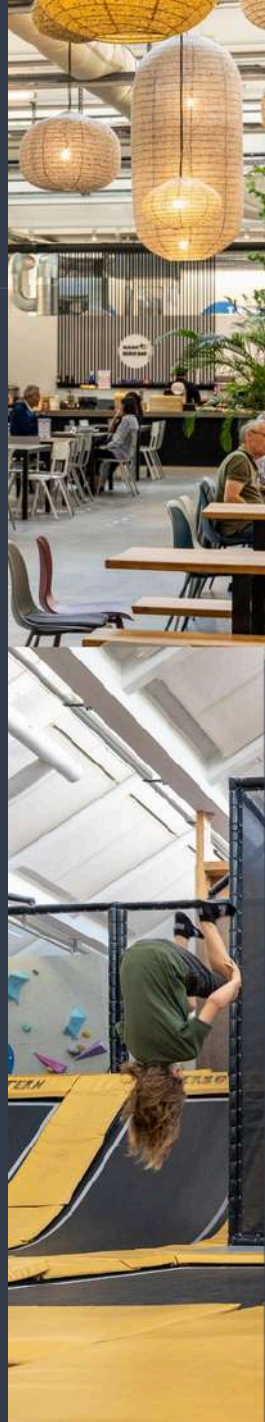

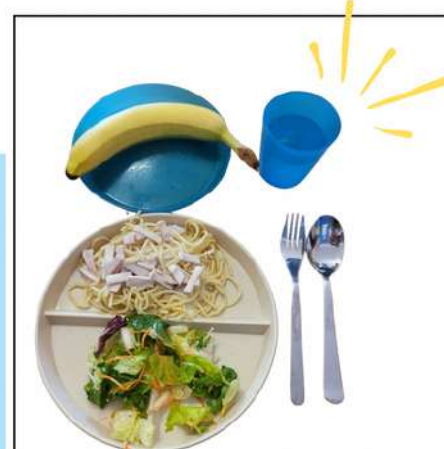
