I would like to congratulate and thank the different representatives that form the ISCS Student Council, as well as Ms. McCoubrey for leading this important school body.

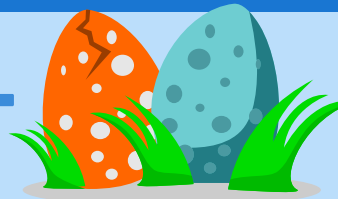

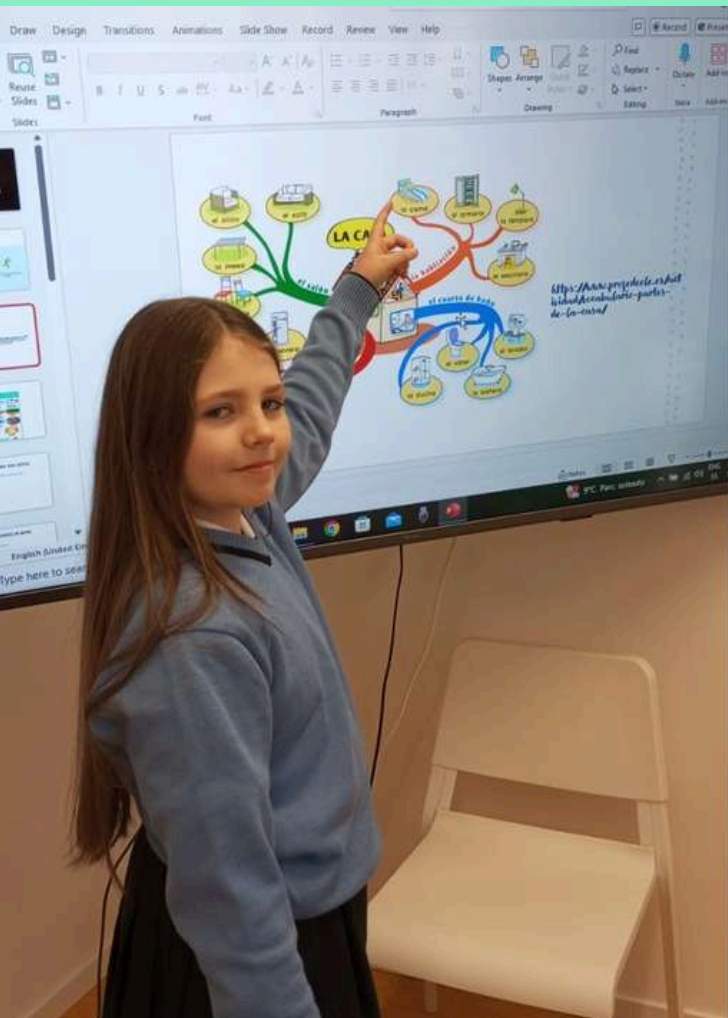


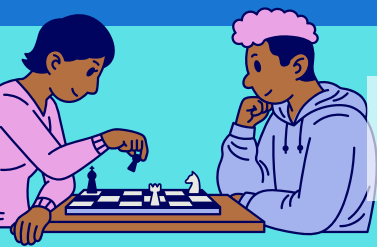
# - MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS -

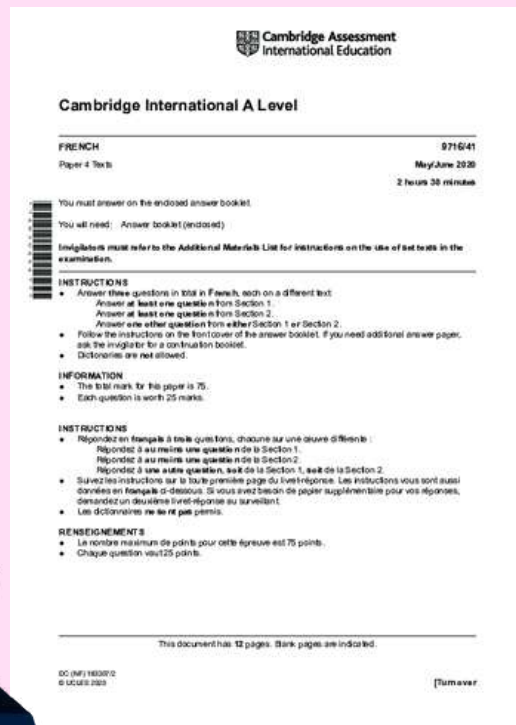


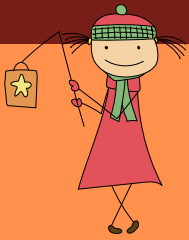
# - HIGH SCHOOL NEWS -

# RÄBELIECHTLI



While the last hurrahs of Halloween still echo through the school's corridors, on Thursday, the Parents' Organisation was happy to observe a much older autumnal tradition, one more akin to the harvest festivals of millennia ago than the candy-fueled masquerade we indulge 2 weeks ago.

Räbeliechtli, a beloved Swiss tradition, also known as the Lantern Festival, comes from the Swiss German words "Räbe" (turnips) and "Lichtli" (small light), which refers to the original practice of carving lanterns out of turnips.

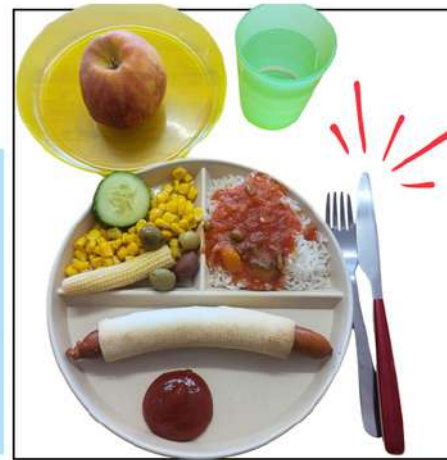

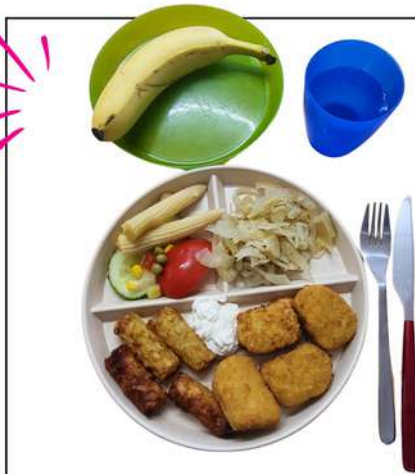

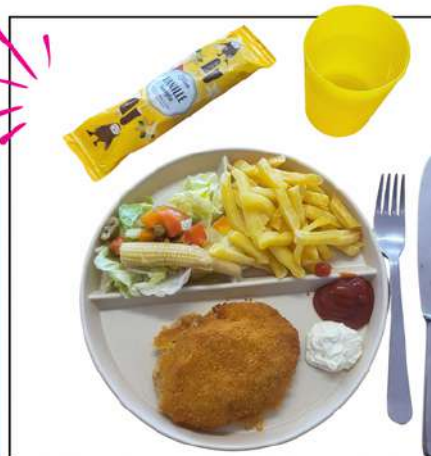
