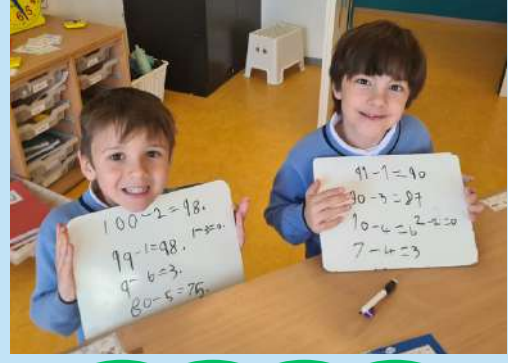

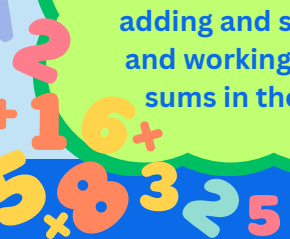
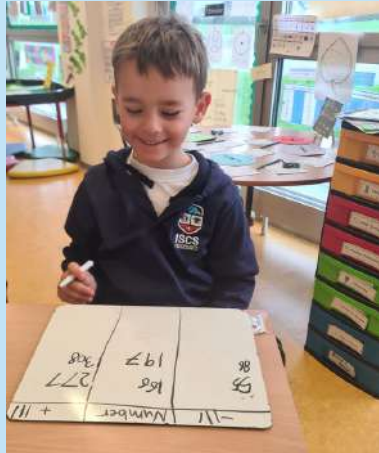
# -PRIMARY-



In Year 1 this term, the children have been exploring all things Rainforest! They have combined their learning through building a rainforest in a shoebox, including all the different layers of the rainforest, and the different types of animals that live there. They used recycled materials and different joints to build each feature.



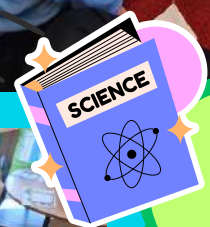
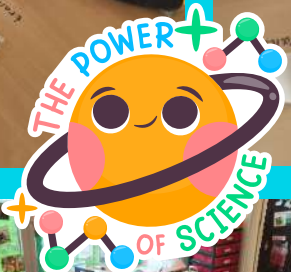

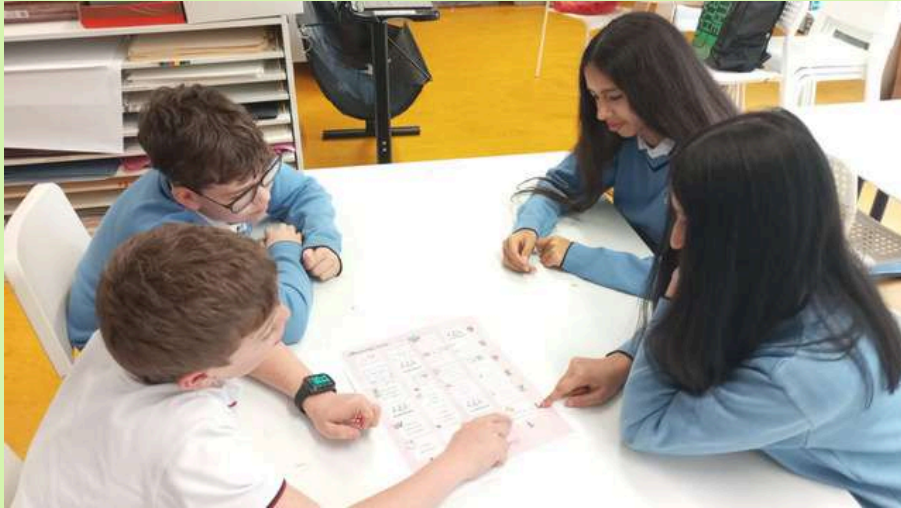


# -PRIMARY-

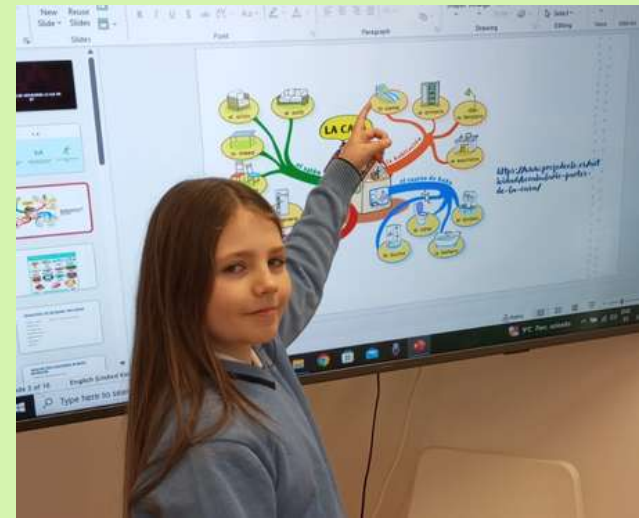


In Science, we have been learning about materials, and how to identify them using their properties. We have conducted many experiments to describe a material's properties, such as which ones are transparent, translucent or opaque, and which can float or sink.

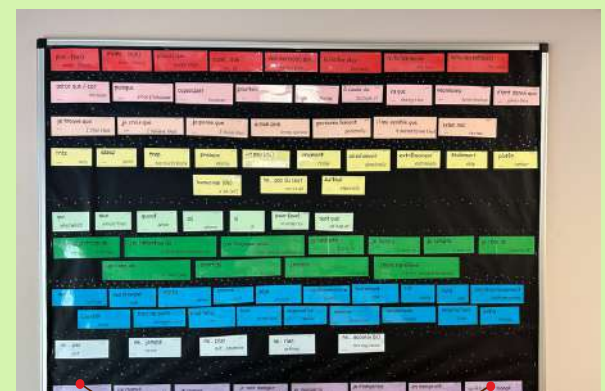
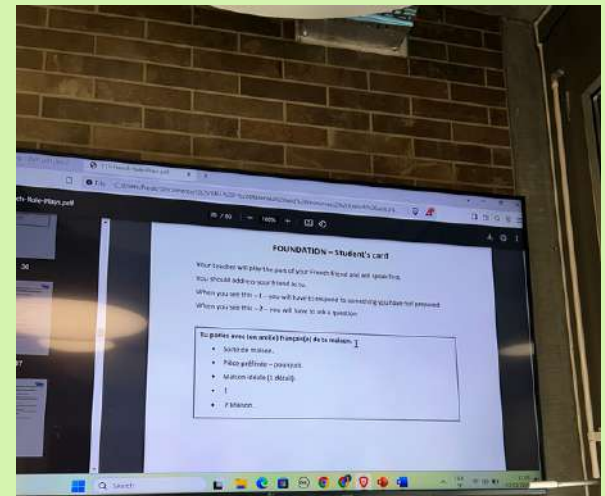
Bonjour les parents!

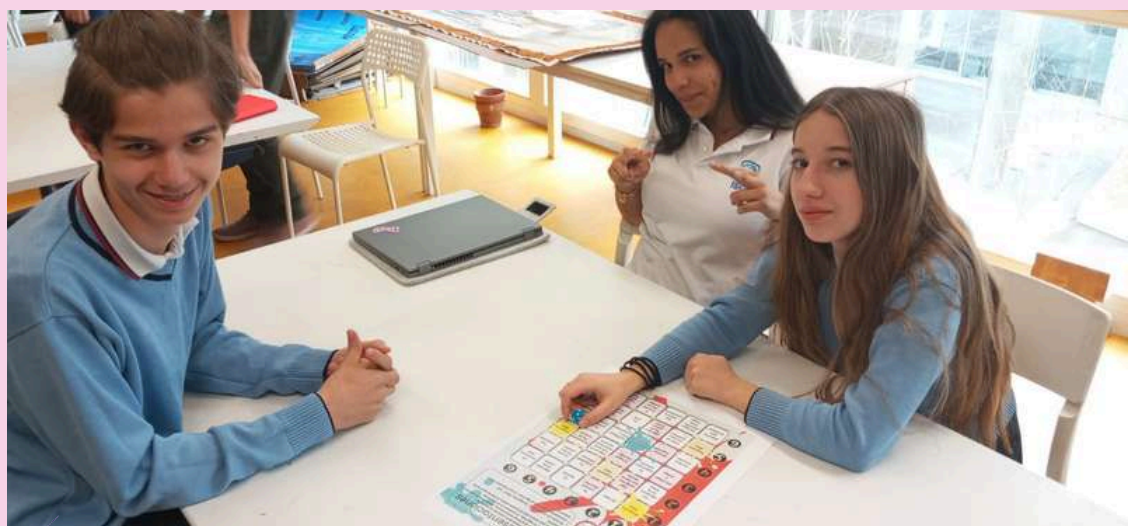


# - HIGH SCHOOL -

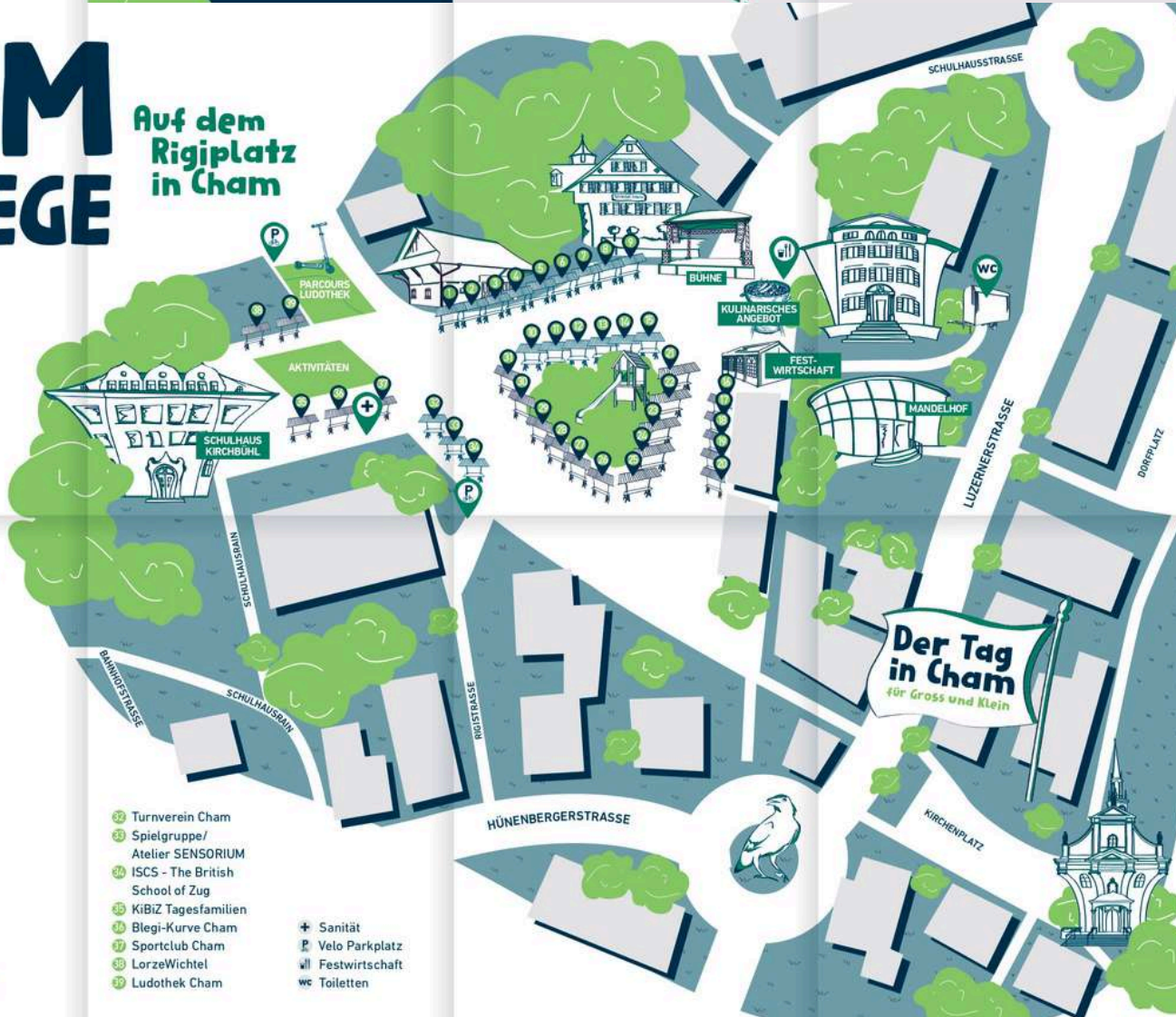

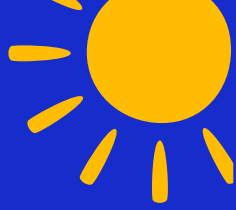

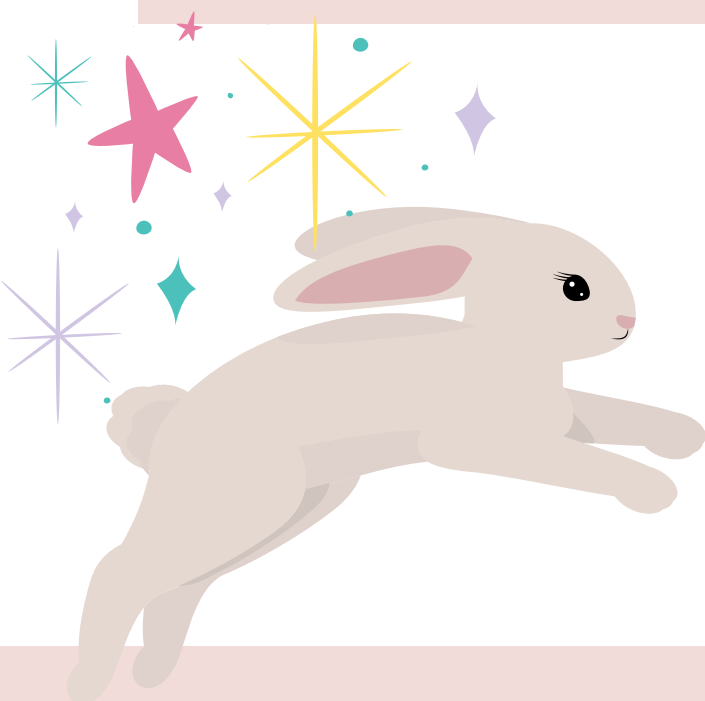
