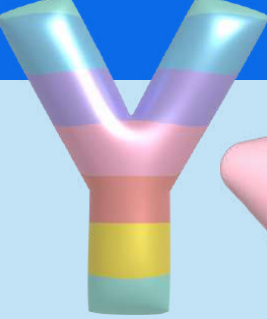

Finally, congratulations to our talented cast – your dedication and enthusiasm are truly inspiring. Well done!

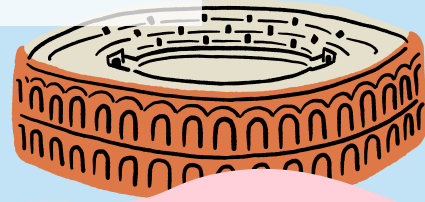

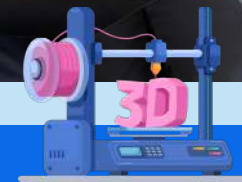


In maths, they have also been focusing on word problems and the vocabulary surrounding different mathematical operations.

## Taking the Lead, Trekking the Hills: Our Pupils Take on The Duke of Edinburgh Award!



Boots laced, rucksacks packed, compasses (mostly) pointing the right way – our pupils are fully immersed in the Duke of Edinburgh Award programme. From Bronze to Silver, they're navigating more than just muddy trails- they are learning independence, teamwork, and what happens when you don't pack enough snacks.

The DofE Award isn't just about physical challenge – it's a real-world classroom where pupils learn how to plan, persist, and push their limits. It is an internationally recognised programme that gives young people the chance to build practical skills, develop resilience and experience real adventure. Pupils work through four key sections: Volunteering, Physical, Skills, and the Expedition. The expedition section has involved planning and completing challenging hikes, carrying full kit, navigating unfamiliar routes, and learning how to keep going when things get tough.

And leading the charge is our very own Mr Evison – physics teacher and Chief-Adventurer. He keeps spirits high, maps dry, and morale positively charged. You could say he accelerates the fun, even when energy levels are approaching absolute zero.

Congratulations to all the pupils who took part – for showing brilliant teamwork, impressive independence, and excellent outdoor cooking skills. We're proud of every step you took!





# - HIGH SCHOOL -



This May, we are running a series of workshops on cyberbullying, led by experienced professionals from the Kanton of Zug. One session has already taken place, with more to follow in the coming weeks. The workshops aim to raise awareness, promote responsible online behaviour, and equip pupils with the tools they need to stay safe and support others in digital spaces. As pupils increasingly interact online, it is vital they understand both the risks involved and their responsibilities. These sessions are age-appropriate, interactive, and encourage open discussion around digital respect, empathy, and online conduct.

In March, our teaching staff took part in a professional development session delivered by the same team, gaining useful strategies to help pupils navigate the digital world. Addressing cyberbullying is a shared responsibility between schools, families, and the wider community, and these workshops form part of our ongoing commitment to creating a safe, respectful, and supportive learning environment both online and offline.

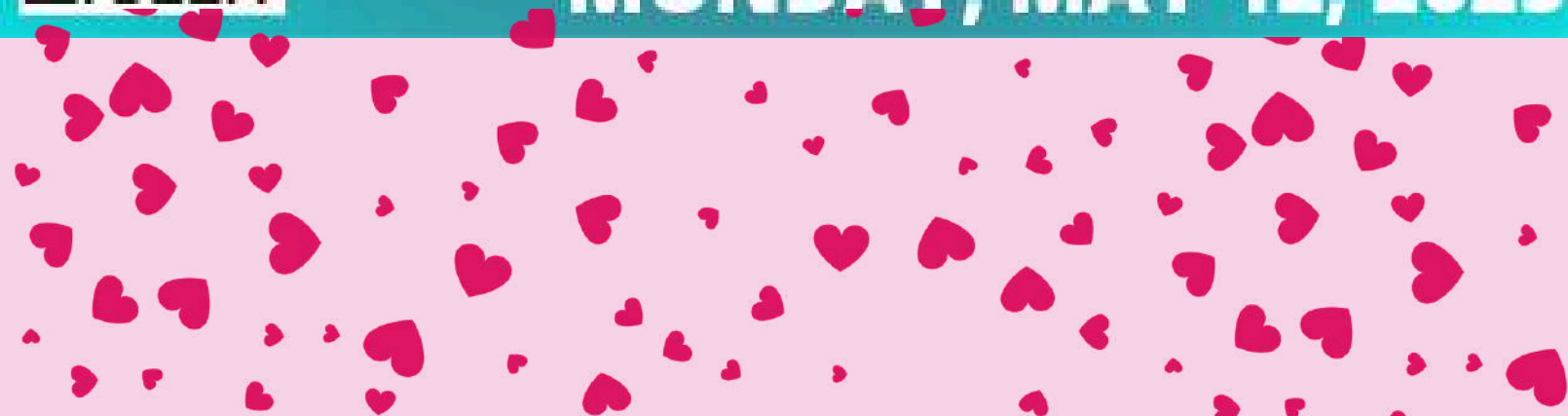

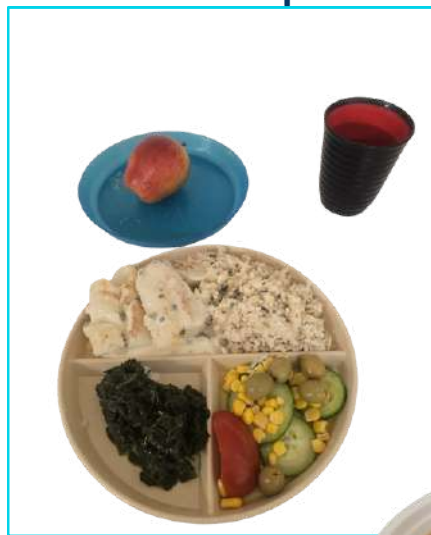
