We will build upon that insight and dive into societal changes, crisis and chaos as we examine World War I and its aftermath, as it gives rise to concentration of government power and burgeoning dictatorial characters in Italy, Germany and the Soviet Union that ends up shaping many of the major events of the 20th century.



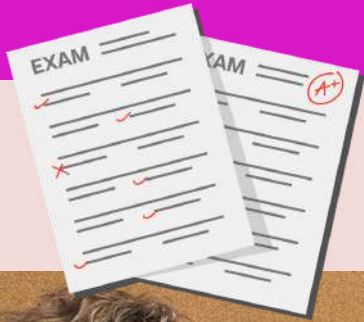
Year 7 students recently visited the Natur-Museum Luzern, guided by their Science teacher, Mr. Santos, to gather inspiration for their upcoming projects. The museum offers an engaging exploration of the natural world, with exhibitions focused on Earth sciences, biology, and the fascinating world of insects. Pupils explored the geological history of Switzerland, observed regional flora and fauna, and studied an extraordinary insect collection, including specimens from the renowned entomologist Walter Linsenmaier. The visit sparked scientific curiosity through hands-on exhibits and interactive displays, offering a memorable experience that brought their classroom learning to life.

Seeing original artworks helps students understand how artists use colour, texture, and form to express ideas. This experience encourages them to experiment with new methods and develop their own artistic voice. Back in the classroom, they'll have the chance to turn these impressions into creative projects, using what they've seen to push their work further.

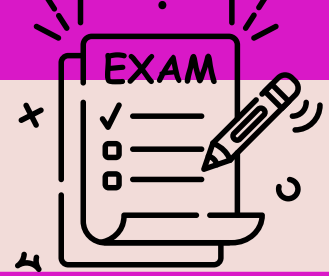

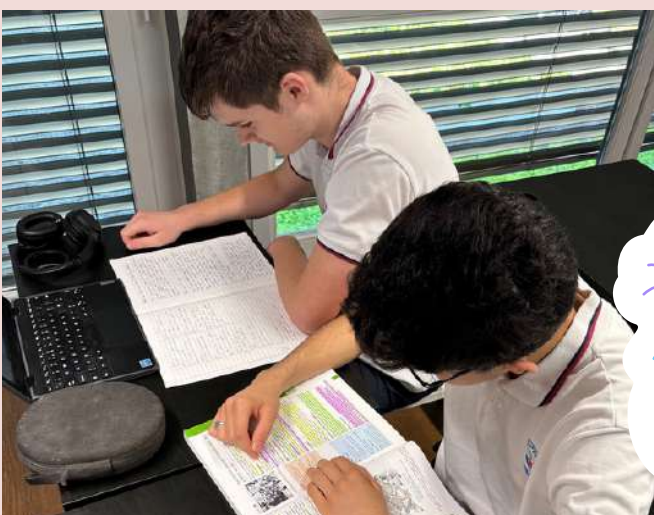


Year 11 Historians Gear Up for IGCSE Paper 2

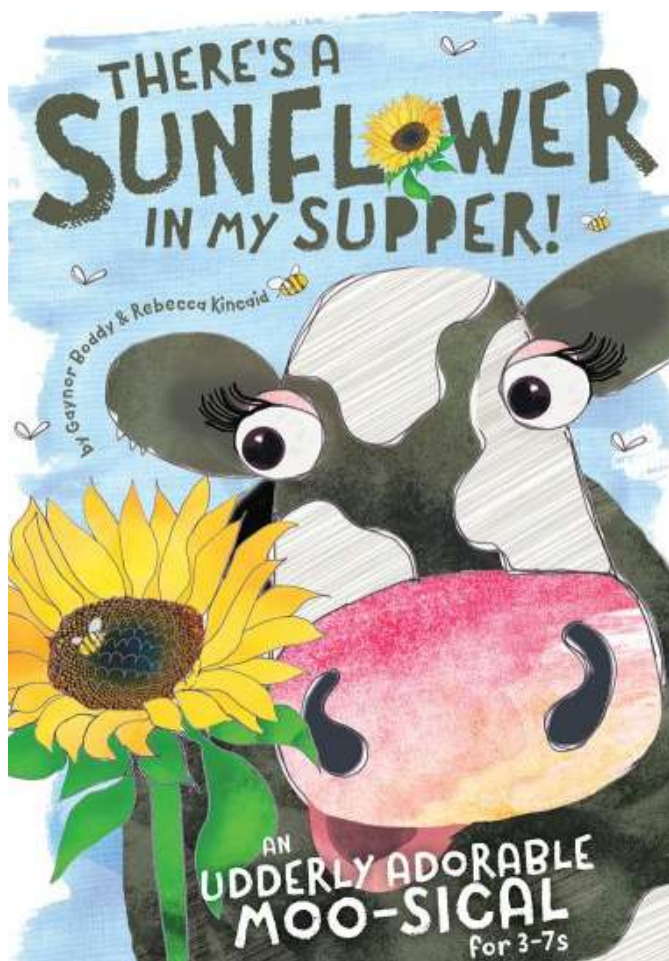

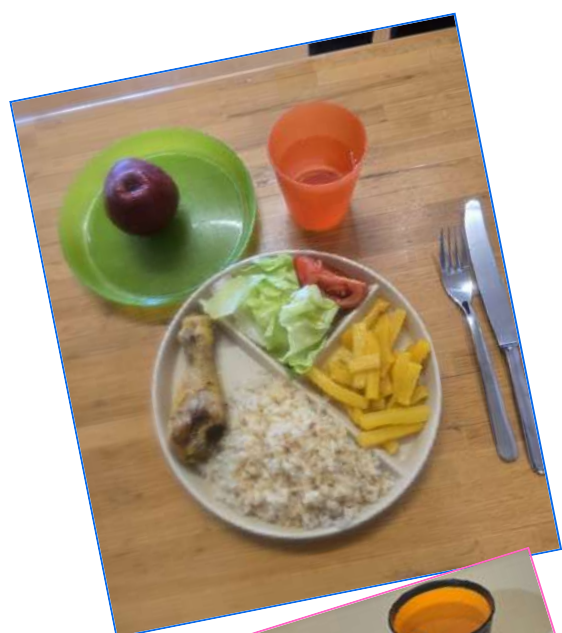
