Science in 3D: Year 7 showcase creative particle models!

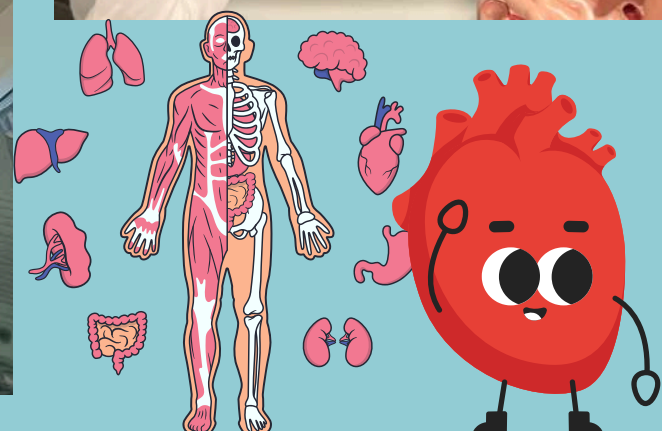
Our Year 7 scientists showed off their imagination and understanding of science this week by building fantastic models of particles in solids, liquids, and gases. From carefully arranged solids to free-flowing liquids and fast-moving gases, their models brought these invisible ideas to life in a fun and creative way. A big shout-out goes to Shalin, whose clever use of containers to represent each state of matter made her models especially impressive!





Year 8 Science – The Human Body in Focus

In Year 8, we began the year by exploring the fascinating topic of the human body. After revisiting last year's work on the digestive system, students are now delving into the circulatory and respiratory systems. They are learning to identify the key organs involved, to understand how these systems are connected, and to see why the body depends on them to release and transport energy. Lessons include lively discussions that encourage pupils to share ideas, ask questions, and make connections between different concepts. In addition, they are discovering the value of regular homework and short assessments in helping them consolidate their learning and retain information more effectively.

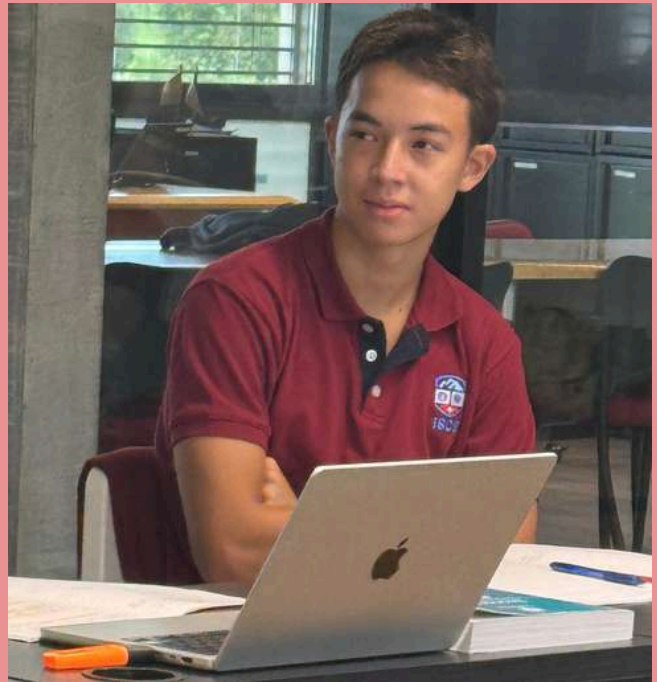


ECONOMICS
