much more!






#### **MIDDLE SCHOOL**



Year 8 Science - The Human Body in **Focus** 

In Year 8, we began the year by exploring the fascinating topic of the human body. After revisiting last year's work on the digestive system, students are now delving into the circulatory and respiratory systems. They are learning to identify the key organs involved, to understand how these systems are connected, and to see why the body depends on them to release and transport energy. Lessons include lively discussions that encourage pupils to share ideas, ask questions, and make connections between different concepts. In addition, they are discovering the value of regular homework and short assessments in helping them consolidate their learning and retain information more effectively.







# HIGH SCHOOL

Students have been learning what the final assessments will look like. Ms
Shaikh explained in detail how important it is to understand what the examiners are looking for, so our pupils can obtain maximum marks. She explained objectives for every part of the exam: knowledge, analysis and evaluation.

The teacher also discussed criteria for marking and how our students have to keep this in mind when answering questions and how they can self-check for maximum points.

















Soon, we will introduce the Student Council leaders, the President, Vice-President and Secretary, who will be leading this fantastic student body at school


