People wear colorful costumes, parade through the streets, eat special treats, and throw confetti. We celebrate it to have one last big party before the quiet time of Lent, and also to drive away winter and welcome spring. It is a very old tradition that has been going on for hundreds of years, since the Middle Ages. Did you know that.....

-During Fasnacht, people eat special sweet doughnuts called Fastnachts, sometimes filled with jam or chocolate, which are fried just once a year and enjoyed fresh during the festival.

-Fasnacht is often called the "fifth season" because it lasts several days with parades, music, and parties, making it feel like its own special season of fun before Lent.





