In Maths, groups of students are presenting their individualised projects on designing fully costed, all-inclusive holiday packages. A great way to extend students with real life maths.

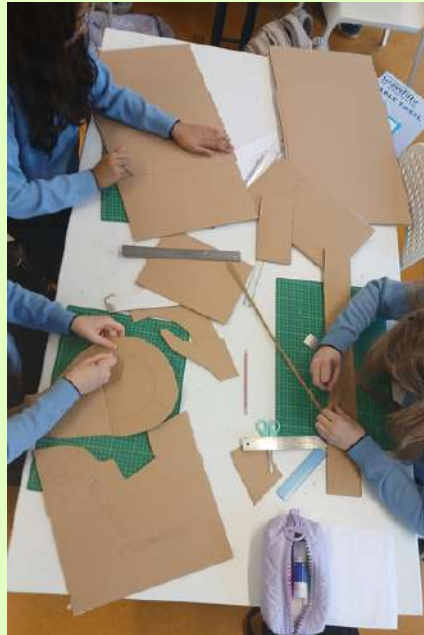

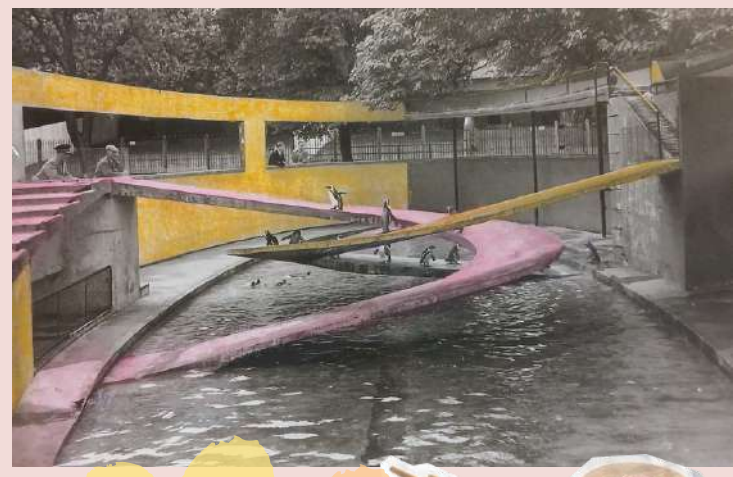
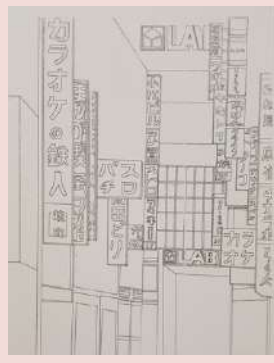
This term, our Art and Design KS3 students have been working under the following themes 'Pattern and form', 'Traditional vs Contemporary Still life', and 'Image & words'. Y7s continue with their explorations of main visual language elements with a focus on pattern and form, and applying these to 2D and 3D responses, Y8s have been consolidating drawing skills through knowledge of form and are also exploring 3D sculpture, and finally Y9s have been introduced to printmaking and responded creative briefs to produce illustrations on the relationship between images and words in artworks. Excellent 'work in progress' artworks by our students! and looking forward to more during the summer term.

Massive congratulations to ISCS students who competed at the International Chess Tournament in Zürich!!! We secured a 1st and 3rd place!!!

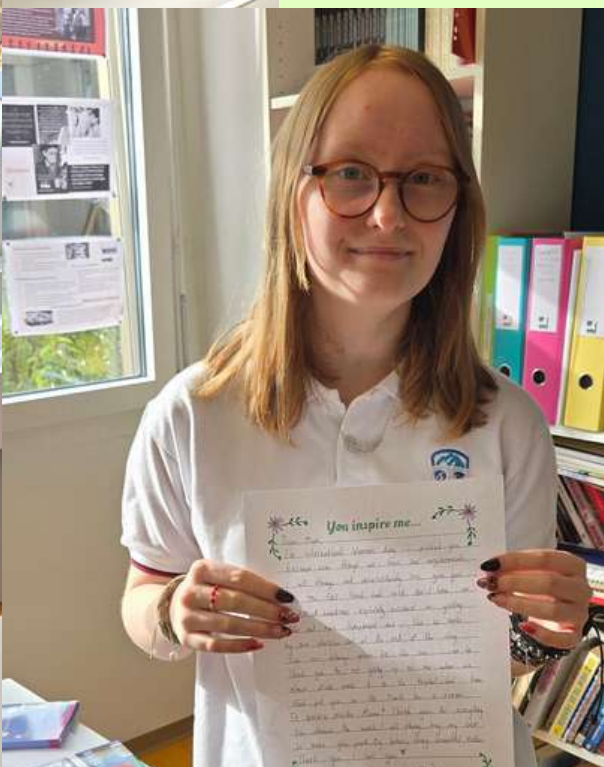
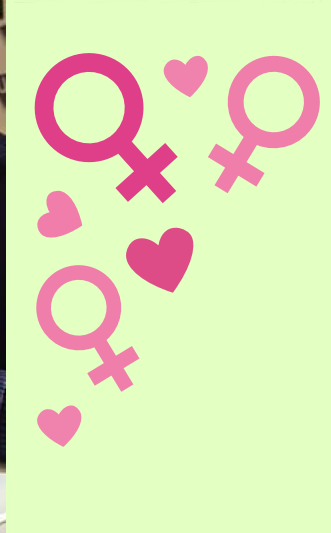
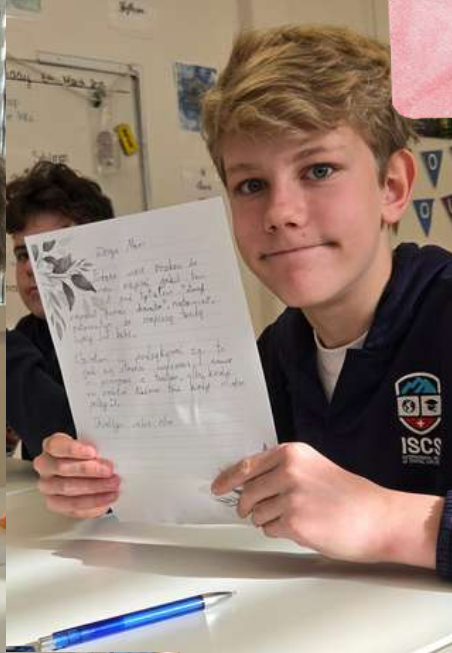
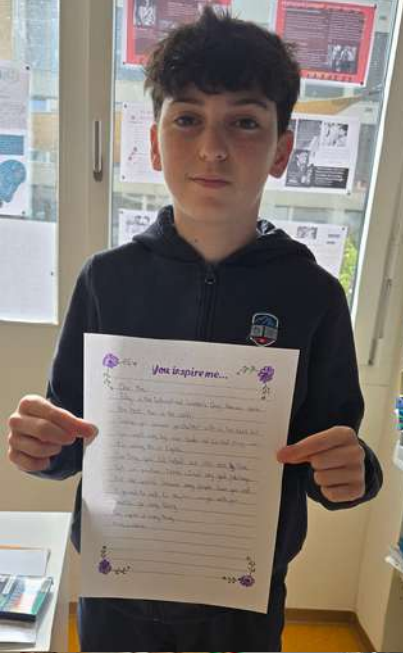
