# PRIMARY SCHOOL






# Kangaroo Maths Olympiad (Primary)

This March, pupils at ISCS from both primary and middle school are taking part in the internationally recognised Kangaroo Maths Olympiad—one of the largest mathematics competitions in the world, bringing together millions of pupils from over 90 countries each year. Unlike traditional tests, the questions are designed to spark curiosity, focusing on logical reasoning, problem-solving, and creative thinking rather than memorisation. Pupils are encouraged to think independently, explore different strategies, and enjoy the process of solving problems.

Year 9 Students Explore Video Game Design with Unity

This term, Year 9 students have been diving into the exciting world of video game development through our Video Game Design using Unity unit. Throughout the course, students have explored the fundamental concepts and technical skills required to create a 3D video game from scratch.

Students began by learning how to work with Scenes in Unity to design and organize the game environment. From building the game area to placing and configuring objects, they developed an understanding of how a virtual world is structured. As the term progressed, students also gained experience in writing C# scripts, allowing them to control how objects behave and interact within the game.

By combining design, problem-solving, and programming, students have been able to transform their creative ideas into fully playable prototypes.







# MIDDLE SCHOOL

We are very proud of the enthusiasm and innovation shown by the Year 9 students, and we look forward to seeing which games will take home the first ISCS Gaming Award!






## IGCSE and AS Computer Science Exam Preparation

Students preparing for the IGCSE and AS Computer Science examinations have been focusing on consolidating their knowledge through intensive past paper practice this term. By working through real exam questions, students are becoming more familiar with the exam format while revising key areas of the syllabus.


Alongside past papers, lessons are dedicated to revisiting important theoretical topics covered throughout the year, including areas such as data representation, computer systems, networking, and databases. Students are also strengthening their understanding of SQL, practising how to write queries to retrieve and manipulate data effectively.

Particular attention has also been given to pseudocode, one of the most challenging components of the curriculum. To support this, innovative self-created gamification practice tools have been introduced, helping students develop their algorithmic thinking and problem-solving skills in a more interactive way.

This combination of theory revision, practical exercises, and targeted exam practice is helping students build confidence and prepare effectively for their upcoming examinations.
