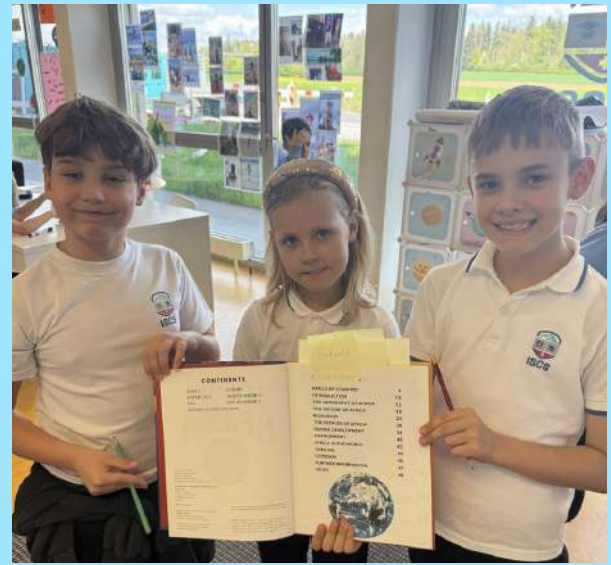




PRIMARY SCHOOL

HIGH SCHOOL



We are incredibly proud to share a remarkable achievement by our pupils. Their project has been awarded "flight status" in the prestigious Astro Pi Mission Space Lab programme – an international competition run in collaboration with the European Space Agency.

This is not a typical school competition. Teams of young people from across Europe and partner countries design and code real scientific experiments in Python, with the goal of having their programs run on the International Space Station (ISS).

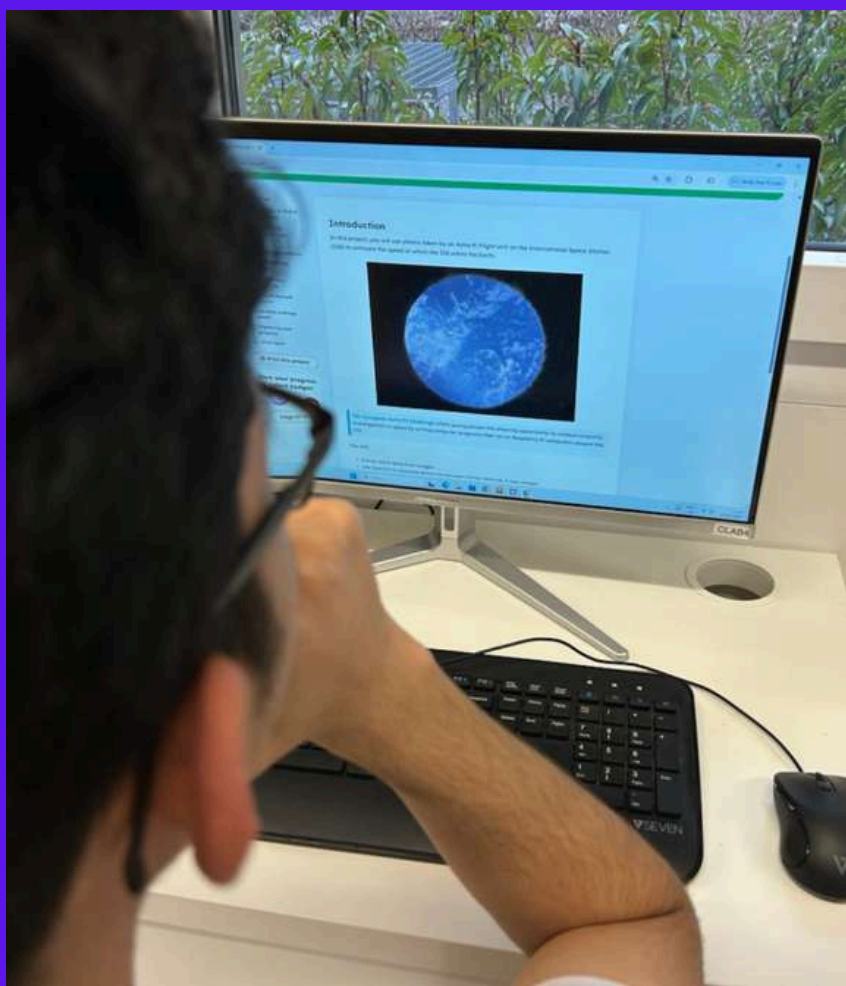
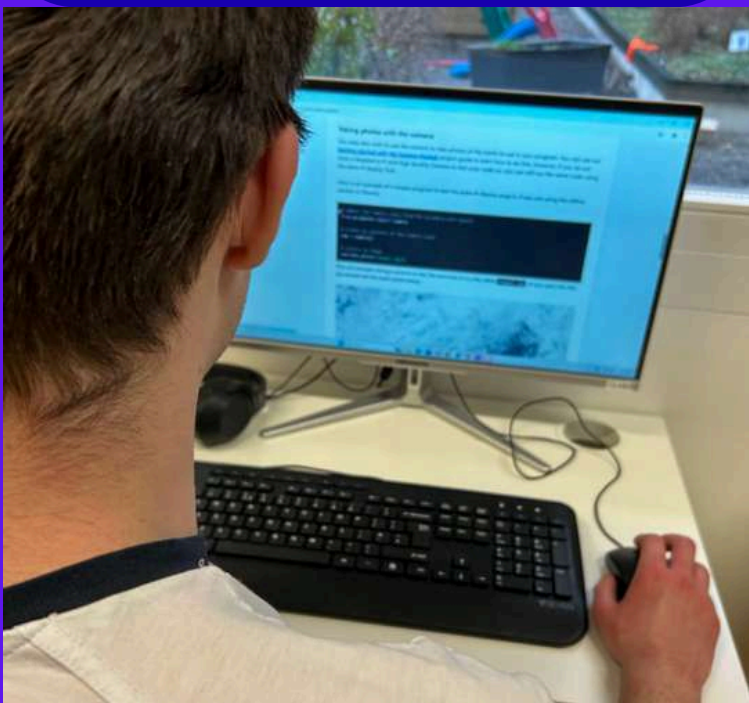
Our pupils' work has successfully passed this process. Their code will run in orbit between April and May 2026, collecting real data from space – an experience achieved by only a select group of teams each year.

The competition itself is highly demanding. Pupils work in small teams, combining coding, physics, mathematics, and problem-solving to tackle real scientific challenges, such as calculating the speed of the ISS using data gathered in space.

This achievement reflects not only technical skill, but also resilience, collaboration, and intellectual curiosity at a very high level.

We are immensely proud of the dedication, creativity, and ambition our pupils have shown throughout this process. Seeing their work travel beyond Earth and run on the International Space Station is an extraordinary milestone – and a moment they will remember for the rest of their lives.

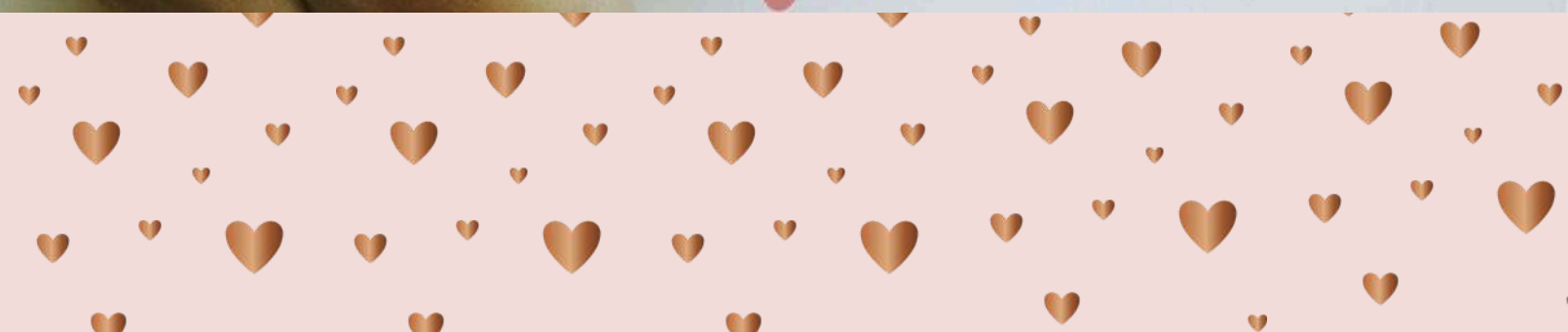
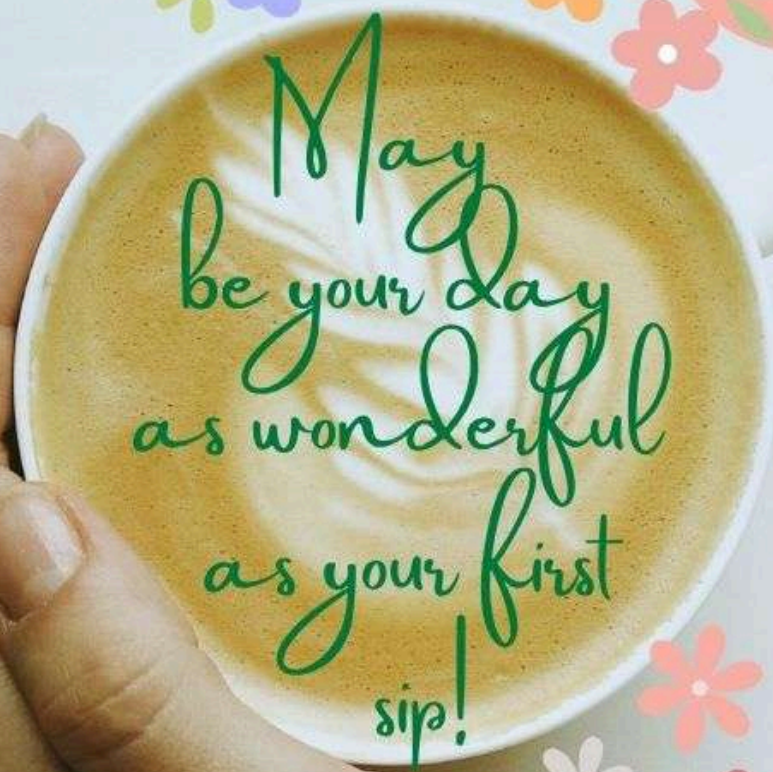

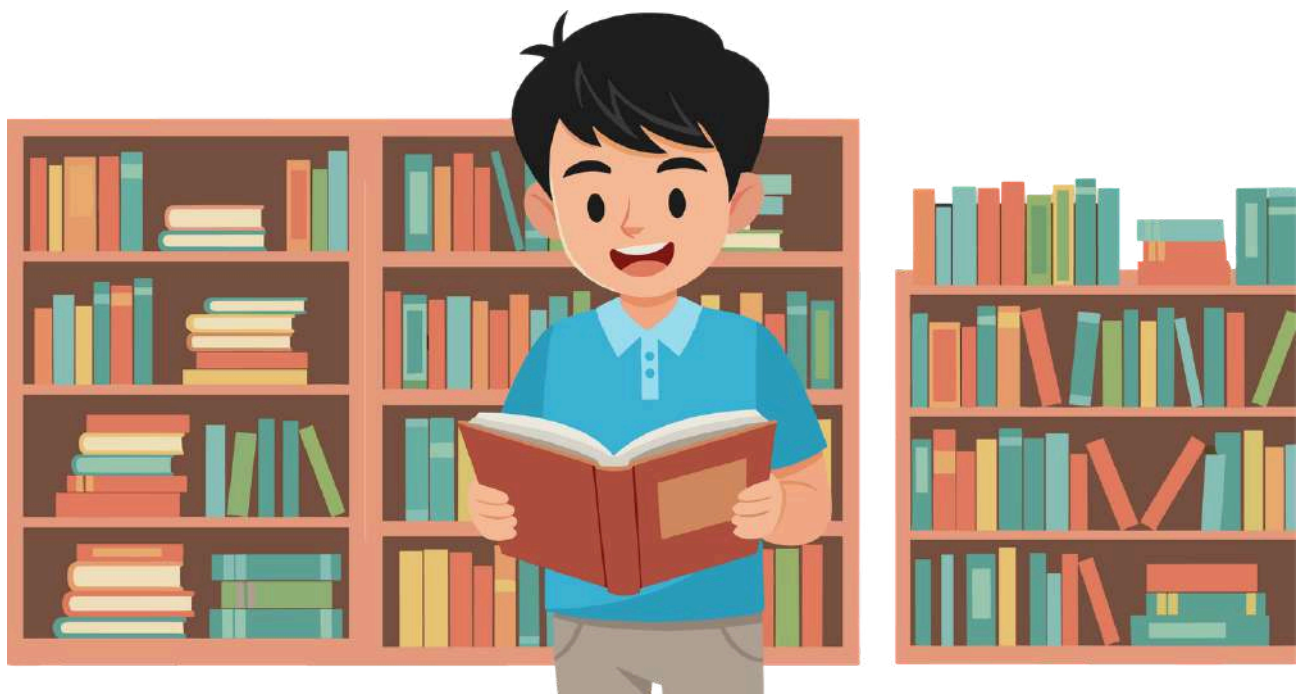
