Bringing their knowledge to life, they designed and created their own musical instruments, carefully gathering materials over the Easter holiday to construct, test, and refine their designs.

We concluded this exciting project with a collaborative session where students played their instruments together, celebrating both their creativity and scientific understanding. 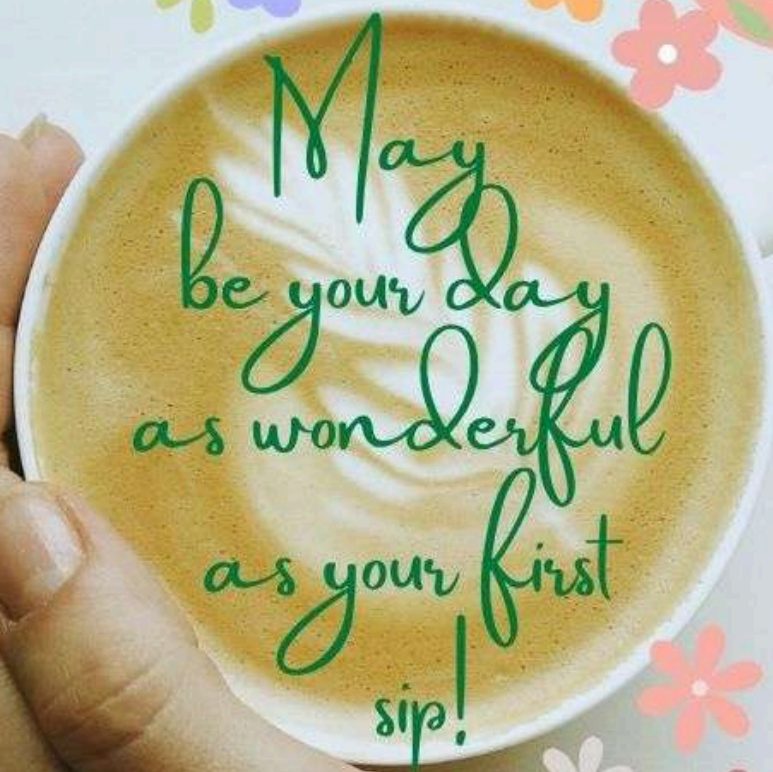

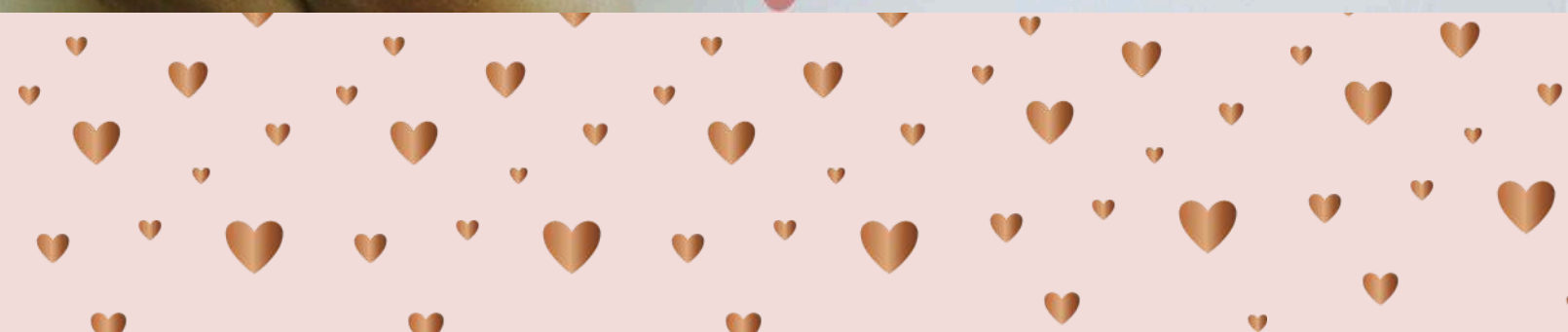
