PRIMARY SCHOOL German



This week in Y 1/2, we have been developing our reading skills through shared reading, phonics, and comprehension activities. The children practised using phonics strategies to decode unfamiliar words, read with increasing fluency, and discuss what they have read by answering questions about characters, settings, and key events in the text.

This week in Y3/4 beginners' class we have been working on our topic of food. The children have been practicing how to say what their favourite foods are, as well as what they like eating and drinking. They have also learnt some adjectives to describe foods and drinks. The children have been practicing writing longer sentences with connectives. Children have also been practicing writing paragraphs about what their friends like using third person verbs.



This week in Year 5/6 the Advanced group has been learning how to write postcards in German. Pupils practised describing their holidays in the present tense, including activities they are doing, places they are visiting, and what the weather and food are like. They also developed their speaking skills through conversations about holiday experiences

MIDDLE SCHOOL



GERMAN:

When revising new German vocabulary, use the “look, cover, say, write, check” method to practise spellings and help new words stay in your memory.

ENGLISH:

Focus on understanding command words (like explain, compare, identify) because they tell you exactly how to structure your answer and can help you avoid losing easy marks. Practice under timed conditions using past questions, then review mark schemes carefully to see how model answers are phrased and what examiners reward.

SCIENCE:

Do not to leave everything until the last minute. Revise your notes regularly after each class and stay consistent with your homework. When planning your revision time, make sure to set realistic goals: work for 50 minutes with one very clear objective in mind - for example, revising and making notes on plant nutrition - and then take a 15-minute break. Afterwards, begin another 50 minutes of focused revision, whether that involves note-taking and active recall or solving past paper questions.



SPANISH:

Create flashcards with vocabulary from the topics. Review the grammar and verbs you have marked in Google Classroom. Don't leave everything until the last day; plan your study time and vary the subjects throughout your study sessions. Rest and get enough sleep, do some exercise or take a walk at the end of your study sessions, and eat properly.

MATHEMATICS:

Work with others to tackle challenging problems by sharing ideas, spotting patterns, and explaining your reasoning, just as Year 8, 9 and 10 did this week. Then strengthen your understanding by practising similar questions independently so you can apply the methods confidently on your own.

GERMAN:

Revision Tip: Practise German vocabulary little and often. Use flashcards to test yourself on new words and try saying each word aloud in a full sentence. This helps you remember the meaning, pronunciation, and how to use the word correctly in context.

FRENCH:

My tip for French is to use Listening tools (Languagenut, social media, youtube) to further develop listening skills before the final paper in June!

COMPUTER SCIENCE:

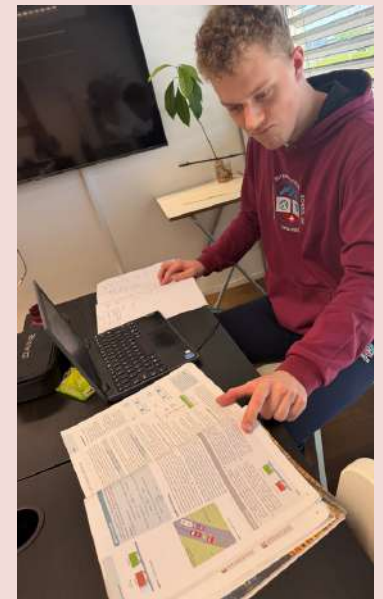
Focus on understanding the main ideas instead of memorizing definitions. Learning how computers think and process information will make topics easier later. Go back and retry activities or questions you found difficult before. Practicing your weaker areas helps you improve and build confidence over time. Review your notes regularly and explain topics in your own words. Teaching a concept to a friend or classmate can help you remember it better.

ENGLISH:

Improve your reading responses by practicing how to select precise quotations and explain their effects clearly, especially language choices and writer's techniques. For the writing section, plan your structure for 3-5 minutes before you start so your ideas are organized, with varied sentence structures and ambitious vocabulary to boost marks.

ART - Assessment information including Art and Design briefs can be found in Google Classroom. Read these carefully.

Preparation for assessments involves the planning of ideas through sketching and deciding what materials and techniques will be used.

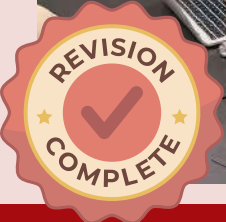


ENGLISH LITERATURE:

Always revisit, reread and revise all of the materials (one read through is not enough!). Ensure that you have relevant pieces of context to tie into your essays and that all AO's are included in each PETAL style paragraph. Always ensure that you have a clear link directly back to the key terms of the question. Have a 'quote bank' in your head for each character and theme that might come up in the exam

SCIENCE:

Make sure you have learnt from it, by testing yourself. When you read a textbook page or watch a video, make sure you have learnt from it by: testing afterwards whether you can describe and explain the key points by yourself. When you get a practice exam question wrong, make sure you have learnt from it by: testing afterwards whether you can do it correctly by yourself. Keep testing yourself, without the help of your notes, until you can get it right. Then test yourself again later that day, the next day, and a few days later, so that you strengthen the memory.

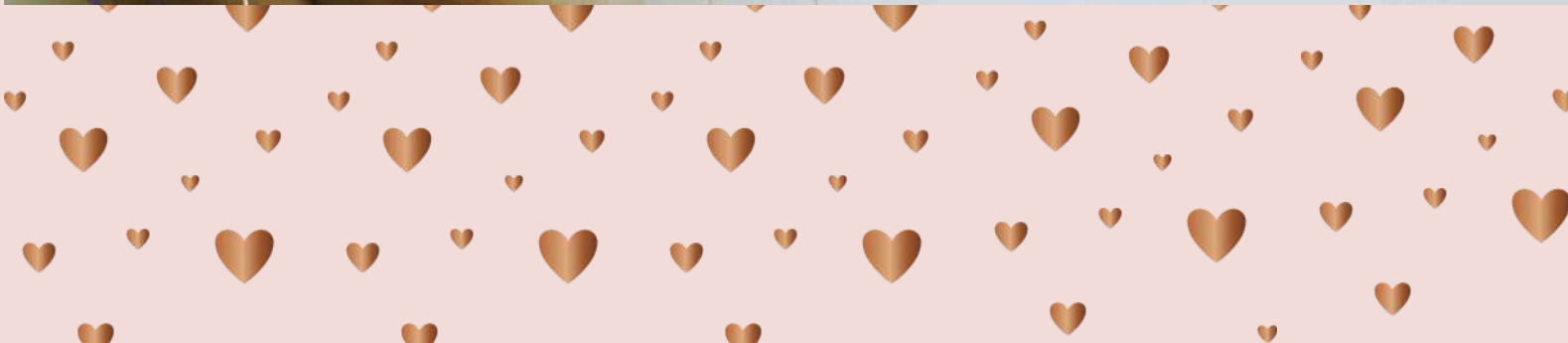
